#### 2. Introductions:

**3. Approval of Minutes:** Califf asked the UCC members if any changes/edits should be submitted. Falbe indicated that her name was omitted from the attendance portion of the minutes. Califf specifies that Gawron (guest) can make this edit. Hearing no other edits to the minutes, the minutes were approved.

#### 4. Proposed Discussion and Action:

#### a. B.S. in Cybersecurity - Carlson, Pence

Carlson mentioned briefly that most of the proposal was already discussed at the previous UCC meeting. She prompts Gawron (guest) to explain the various concerns with the proposal since Gawron (guest) reached out to resolve the editorial concerns. Gawron (guest) explained what the two concerns were (IT 398 and substitute options and the ECO 101/102 rationale). Califf prompts the UCC members if any discussion is needed. Hearing no discussions, Carlson moved for a vote. Pence seconded. 12 voted in favor. 0 Abstentions. 0 Nays. The approved catalog copy is below:

#### b. Family and Consumer Sciences – Teacher Education – Paolucci, Johnston

Paolucci/Johnston indicated that the program changes do appear complex generally but makes sense when looked at thoroughly. They specified the changes as removing FCS 203, removing FCS 330/333 as options, mandating FCS 232, and adding FCS 353/354 as required courses. They specified that the hours were being reduced with this change. Califf gave general background that these types of changes, while multifaceted, make a lot of sense. Johnston requested a minor edit given that some of the copy did not reflect as accurately as it should have been. Gawron (guest) made the edits in real time and the UCC members were satisfied with the edits. Newport asked generally how these proposals affects students. Lindsey (guest) explained how catalog years work and the various nuances that interact with programs across different catalog years. For example, Lindsey (guest) indicated that sometimes students can request to change catalog years (by approval of their academic advisor). Califf provided additional information about how waivers can be used to support students if changes were made to a program, but the changes did not affect students of previous catalogs years. Ray (guest) provided additional wording/context between "waivers" and "exception petitions." Paolucci moved for a vote on the proposal. Johnston seconded. 14 voted in favor. 0 Abstentions. 0 Nays. Below is the approved catalog copy:

# c. Elementary Education - Paolucci, Johnston

Paolucci/Johnston indicated that the changes on both proposals (Elementary Education and Elementary Education – Bilingual/Bicultural Teacher Education Sequence) are the same and exceptionally simple. They explained the changes to both proposals at the same time indicating that the only change was to MAT 201. MAT 201 increased from 3 credit hours to 4 credit hours, which affected these teaching programs. Hurd indicated concern that their hours were being increased with this change and that the add hours form was signed with the idea that the hours are potentially not changing given the ECO requirement in the program. Lindsey (guest) explained that counting hours usually defaults to the lower credit hour path through the program and that, regardless of which ECO course they take, the program will increase in total hours. Gawron (guest) confirmed this and indicated that is the precedent. Paolucci moved for a vote. Johnston seconded. 12 voted in favor. 0 Abstentions. 0 Nays. Below is the approved catalog copy:



<u>b. Council for Teacher Education:</u> Hurd indicated CTE approved a few proposals from Agriculture. Hurd indicated that the discussion was lively, but the proposal was approved by CTE.

<u>c. Academic Affairs Committee:</u> Hurd indicated AAC has not met this year, but they are still working on IDEAS and updating the various terms/definitions involved in that endeavor. Hurd predicts that IDEAS should be at the Senate floor within approximately two months.

#### 6. Staff Report:

Lindsey (guest) indicated that proposals will be for the 2022-2023 academic catalog starting now. Lindsey (guest) explained that Gawron (guest) will update the agendas to specify this and also explained that the 2021-2022 academic catalog deadlines were in October and November of 2020. Lindsey (guest) also provided context concerning the time it takes to implement the various catalog changes and degree audit changes and why deadlines are important. Lippert asked for clarification of the deadlines for 2022-2023 in which Lindsey (guest) provided that information. Johnston asked a general question concerning how ISU bills students (per credit hour or another method). Lindsey (guest) explained that there is a history with ISU's method of billing students but it currently is per credit hour. Gawron (guest) briefly mentioned that many IDS Minor reviews are on the near horizon, but given the discussion that can occur, the schedule is tentative. Lippert asked for clarification on what is needed for the review. Hurd indicated that a brief overview is needed but an executive summary of what the reviewers feel are the strengths and weaknesses of the IDS minor review is also appropriate. Hurd indicated that Gawron (guest) can send the executive summaries out to the rest of the UCC members so that UCC members can be made aware of the reviewers' thoughts.
